Student Researcher (79016) - Work Study Program

Location: Centre for Human Rights Research, University of Manitoba

Job Description

The Centre for Human Rights Research (CHRR) was established in 2012 to bring together people and organizations - both within and outside the University of Manitoba - to enhance interdisciplinary and collaborative research capacity, create richer training opportunities for students, and facilitate the fusion of research-driven knowledge, public policy and intellectual debate on issues related to human rights and social justice. Current Research Themes at the CHRR include: Borders and Human Rights; Indigenous People and Human Rights; Reproductive and Bodily Justice; Water Rights and Justice.

The **Student Researcher** will assist the CHRR with a variety of secondary research including literature reviews on topics such as the arts and human rights; borders and human rights; and labour rights. The Student Researcher will also develop content for CHRR's online resource hub. This may include research briefs, resource guides, or plain language summaries. The Student Researcher may also assist with event planning. Student researchers will have the opportunity to participate in human rights research workshops/trainings available during the position. The wage for this position is between \$19-23/hour depending on education and experience.

Job Requirements

- Interest in social justice and human rights
- Upper level undergraduate or graduate student preferred
- Successful applicants must be able to work 5-10 hours per week from Sept. 17 2025 (approx.) – March 6, 2026.

Student Eligibility

To be eligible for the work-study program, you must meet the following criteria:

- Have proof of a 2025-2026 government student aid package of at least \$2,000; or, proof of 2025-2026 Indigenous band sponsorship, Metis Nation post-secondary funding, or disability funding.
- 2. Be registered at the University of Manitoba as a full-time undergraduate or graduate student in both terms (Fall 2025 and Winter 2026).
- 3. Have achieved a satisfactory academic standing with a minimum 2.0 institutional grade point average in their previous academic session (not applicable for new UM students).
- 4. Be residing in Manitoba throughout the Work-Study employment term.

International students are not eligible unless they have proof of a government student loan or aid package for the 2025-2026 school year from their home country. Private/educational bank loans are not considered; no exceptions will be made. Proof of government funding must be attached to the student application or will be considered ineligible.
