SOLO EXHIBITION, JAIMIE ISAAC

An exhibition of work and research that provides visual indications of the state and presence of waterways. Mixed media of installation, film and experimental sound, the artworks present a culmination of work produced from Isaac's art residency at the University of Manitoba Just Waters Project, with the Center of Human Rights Research in 2024-25.

Through various lifeways, Isaac is working on reclaiming and restoring a relationship with water, and honouring the continuum of sustained relationships community has maintained for millennia. Many indigenous peoples globally recognize that water is sacred, and countines have passad groundbreaking laws granting legal personhood status to their water systems, honoring the Indigenous peoples' perspective of waters as relatives and ancestors.

In relation to waterways, Lake Winnipeg and the Red River are endangered, telltales that phosphorus is the cause of blue-green algal blooms which are maintained by evidence based research." Telltales builds awareness of water injustices and deepens collective connection to water.
